The design of this front-loaded facility provides the option to cross-dock and/or rail-serve the rear of the building, and it has an expansion capacity of up to 1.2 million square feet, according to TJ O'Brien, development manager for DP's Midwest Region.

Building A features a 32-foot clear height ceiling, 50-by-50-foot bays with 60-foot deep staging bays, up to 120 truck docks in the cross-docked configuration,
